From right here in Tooele County comes a group of hard working everyday guys who decided life is just too short not to make music. So they came together, blew the dust off the instruments, talked the drummer's wife into giving up her basement, and started writing. After a few performances they realized this was getting serious. People were tapping their feet, singing along, and cheering for more. Simply put, Kindle Creek's music draws you in and speaks to you. The writing is honest and real. It captures something of the hopes, fears, and joy of an ordinary life. Whether you are high on life, or down and out, they've been there too. And as you listen, you can't help but feel they are saying exactly what you wanted to say.

The band started in the spring of 2009 when lead singer, and life-long performer, Dillon Hurst, and songwriter / drummer, Bryce Jensen, decided it was time to stop talking about starting a band and actually do it. They knew they wanted something outside the norm to make the band a genuine contender, so they called up the multi-talented Joseph Shumway (vocals, fiddle, mandolin and guitar) and asked if he would be interested in this new adventure. That was a good decision. After one jam session it was obvious to all three they had stumbled into something good. Later other members were added, including David Crowley (lead guitar) and Mical Bracken (bass guitar).

In the two years since band was formed, what started out as a desire to just play good music has grown into an avid love for creating, recording, and performing great music. Together they have created a unique style of country-rock/folk music that appeals to all ages and audiences. In March 2001, they completed their first recording project and released the self titled album / EP, Kindle Creek. The album is available through multiple online vendors, iTunes, and with various local retailers. Several tracks from the EP are currently competing on the MTV partner site OurStage. Two of the tracks have consistently made the top 40 in these competitions. The band was also recently selected as one of the top finalists in the Utah Freedom Festival's nation-wide talent search. Kindle Creek is truly one of Utah's finest up-and-coming entertainers. Don't miss a chance to see this high energy, family friendly, group of Tooele County's own. Leslie Taylor is a great tenor! She has actually sung opera in the past. She is an elementary school librarian, and teaches private voice lessons. She also has been the music director for the local high school plays for 20 years.

Kerry Christensen is not your typical yodeler. His concerts and events this year will take him to as many as 23 US states and two or three countries internationally. Kerry spent two years in the country of Austria right out of high school. There he became interested in the alpine yodeling art. After mastering this difficult medium he was asked in 1983 to move his six member family to Orlando, Florida and use his yodeling skills at Walt Disney World's Epcot Center. He performed there for almost seven years until 1990.

Today Kerry performs all kinds of corporate, festival, and community concert events. He recently lent his unique classical yodeling talent to a full-length Disney animated feature called "Home on the Range."

Kerry is perhaps the only full time yodeler in the world that specializes in all styles of yodeling. He can be strictly alpine, or he can put on his Stetson hat and do an all-cowboy yodeling show. However, many of Kerry's fans say that their favorite show is when Kerry mixes up the styles. You will hear cowboy, alpine, cajun, Latin, Jewish, Hawaiian, jazz, classical, and his always popular humorous yodeling renditions.

Steve Hewson (guitar, lead and harmony vocals), is best known as the host of the Rockport Dam Jam. He hails from Huntington Beach, California proving that country twang can come from the land of sand and surf. After going electric with the country band "Desert Skies," Steve has now returned to his first love of acoustic music with the Ramblers.

He has been a member of various bands such as Done Gone, Three on a String, the Mike Iverson Band, Down Home and Around the Bend. Joe drives 90 miles to band practice.

Rick Martinez has played the 5 string banjo at least 30 years. His style is steeped in traditional and progressive bluegrass music with diverse influences ranging from Earl Scruggs to Tony Trishka.

Dave Bates (Bass) - has been a mainstay in the SLC/Summit County music communities for many years. Dave has been a pilot for Delta, and a bus driver. When he is not flying, he is a farmer in Wanship.
